

RIDDEN (Cont)

The Michelmass Challenge Cup presented by Mrs J.Montgomery. (Winner of class 18).

The Buckley Challenge Cup presented by Mr & Mrs Buckley for the best novice pony ridden by a novice. (Class 18. Eligible riders must wear a RED armband). Neither pony nor rider to have won a first prize in any lead rein class at any show prior to this show day.

The Caroline Fielding Memorial Cup presented by Mrs J Green. (Mini Championship)

The Roo Challenge Trophy presented by Mrs Fielding & Mrs Green. (Winner of class 22).

The Pantmanr DPS Beginners First Ridden Cup presented by Mr. M. Ball. (Winner of class 20).

The Guillebaud Challenge Trophy presented by the Guillebaud family and Mr & Mrs P S Taylor. (Winner of Class 21).

The Roeves Challenge Cup presented by Mrs E.Roeves. (WHP Champion).

The Micklehill Trophy presented by Mrs L.Colley. (Winner of class 29).

The Concours de Dressage Challenge Trophy presented by the Association du Pony Dartmoor. (Highest placed Dartmoor in class 29).

The Lucy IX Trophy presented by Mrs Fey. (Winner of Class 30 Sect. B)

Iris Gould Memorial Trophy for Combined Training presented by Miss M.Gould, Mrs J.Haley and Mr J.Gould for the Dartmoor Pony which has the most points in the WHP and Dressage. Presented at the AGM.

DRIVING

The Ogle Challenge Cup presented by Mrs P.Ogle. (Winner of class 25)

The Ogle Novice Challenge Trophy presented by Mrs P.Ogle. (Highest placed novice pony in Class 25). A novice is a pony which has not won a first prize in any Driving Class with or without Road Drive, up to the closing date of entries.

The Parkinson Challenge Cup presented by Mrs V.Parkinson. (Best non show vehicle in class 25).

NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds. These classes are judged under the rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books. Part Bred's are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern in 2012.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. Judges and/or stewards will check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes and cards. NPS Standard members will be required to upgrade to full membership to enter the final.

NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship – Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white armband in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.

Ring One

- Class 1 Mare 4 years & over without foal, not to have run with or been covered by a stallion in the current year. [Entry £5.00]
- Class 2 Mare 4 years & over without foal, with Service Certificate for the current year. [Entry £5.00]
- Class 3 Yearling Colt or Gelding. (See Rule 10) [Entry £5.00]
- Class 4 Yearling Filly. [Entry £5.00]
- Class 5 2 & 3 year old Colt. (See Rule 10). [Entry £5.00]
- Class 6 2 year old Filly or Gelding. [Entry £5.00]
- Class 7 3 year old Filly or Gelding. [Entry £5.00]
- Class 8 1,2 & 3 year old Filly or Gelding and Yearling Colt - for novice ponies and owners, neither pony nor owner to have won a first prize in hand at the Dartmoor Pony Society Championship Show. (Excluding Foal Classes) [Entry £5.00]
- Class 9 Stallion 4 years & over. (See Rule 10). [Entry £5.00]
- Class 10 Novice Brood Mare, 4 years and over with own foal at foot. For mares which have never won a first prize in a Dartmoor class with a foal at foot prior to the closing date of entries. [Entry £5.00]
- Class 11 Foal by a registered Dartmoor stallion and out of a mare shown in class 10. [Entry £5.00]
- Class 12 Open Brood Mare, 4 years and over with own foal at foot. [Entry £5.00]
- Class 13 Foal by a registered Dartmoor stallion and out of a mare shown in class 12. [Entry £5.00]

Ring Two

- Class 14 Gelding 4 years old and over. [Entry £5.00]
Class 15 Ridden Part-bred stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. (See Rule 10). [Entry £5.00]
Class 16 Part-bred pony 1,2 or 3 years old to be shown in hand, likely to make a child's pony. Special Rosette for the best yearling. (See Rule 10) [Entry £5.00]
Class 17 Part-bred stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over to be shown in hand. (See Rule 10). [Entry £5.00]

NOTE: ALL Part-bred entries (except foals) at this show must have one fully registered Dartmoor parent or grandparent. (BREEDING SHOWING ELIGIBILITY MUST BE PUT ON THE ENTRY FORM GIVING THE NAME OF THE FULLY REGISTERED DARTMOOR OTHERWISE THE ENTRY WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED). Special Part-bred Dartmoor Rosettes to the highest placed ponies registered in the Part-bred Dartmoor Register. To be eligible for these rosettes P.B.D.R. registration numbers must be given on the entry form.

- Class 18 The NPS/Micor Demolition Ltd M & M Leading Rein National Championship. Open to Registered mares and geldings four years old and over not exceeding 122 cm. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but must not have attained their 9th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. To be shown in a snaffle bit. (Novice ponies/Riders see Buckley Cup) [Entry £5.00]
NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship – wear white armbands
- Class 19 The NPS/RHR Demolition Ltd M & M Junior Ridden National Championship. Open to registered mares and geldings four years old and over. Riders must not have attained their 14th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. [Entry £5.00]
NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship – wear white armbands
- Class 20 Beginners First Ridden. Open to mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but not have attained their 10th birthday before 1st January in the current year. An attendant may accompany but not lead the pony in the ring. Ponies must be ridden in a suitable bridle. [Entry £5.00]
- Class 21 The NPS/Micor Demolition Ltd M & M First Ridden National Championship. Open to registered mares and geldings four years old and over not exceeding 128cm. Riders must have attained their 3rd Birthday but not reached their 12th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. [Entry £5.00]
NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship – wear white armbands

IN HAND (Cont)

The Dalby Challenge Cup presented by Mrs G Dalby for the best pony bred in Devon from classes 3 – 7.

The Dartmoor Pony Society Yearling Challenge Cup presented by Mr R H N Caunter for the best yearling from classes 3 and 4.

The Brandsby Tornado Challenge Trophy presented by Mrs G Little for the winner of Class 9.

The Boveycombe Challenge Trophy presented by Mrs M I Gould for the best brood mare. (Classes 10 & 12).

The Dunmere Challenge Cup presented by Mrs Fielding & Mrs Green for the best foal. (Classes 11 & 13).

The Senruf Trophy presented by Mrs M Furness for the best Supplementary Registered Pony. (The 2 highest placed eligible ponies in classes 1 - 4, 6 - 8, 10, 12 & 14 to compete)

The Cave Penny Memorial Challenge Cup presented in memory of Miss J L Cave Penny for the exhibitor living in the Dartmoor National Park winning the most points at the show, in hand classes only. Presented at AGM.

The Cherry Challenge Cup presented by Miss J Hamlyn for the stallion whose progeny win the most points in the show. (In hand) Presented at AGM.

The Honeybags Trophy presented by Mrs I McKinlay-Clark for the mare whose progeny win the most points in the Show. (In hand). Presented at the AGM.

The White Willows Banquo Trophy presented by Miss Jessica Faraday for the best child handler (Class 26).

RIDDEN

The Dartmoor Pony Society Challenge Cup presented by Lady Anne Lytton for the Supreme Champion Ridden Pony. (First and second placed ponies from classes 18 - 24).

The Country Life Challenge Cup presented by Country Life Magazine for the best mare or gelding ridden by a child under 17 years on the show day in the Supreme Ridden Championship.

The Brown Heath Challenge Cup presented by Major and Mrs Hayes for the best ridden gelding in the Supreme Ridden Championship.

The NPS/The Minns Mountain and Moorland Ridden Silver Medal Rosette for the Champion (or Reserve) from classes 19, 22 - 24. Winners will be entitled to compete in NPS Mountain & Moorland Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in Malvern in 2012, providing they send to the NPS Office, the relevant entry fee and qualification card provided with the Silver Medal Rosette.

CHAMPIONSHIP AND SPECIAL PRIZES

IN HAND

The Dartmoor Pony Challenge Cup presented by Lady Anne Lytton and Dr E.L.Roberts - to the Supreme Champion of the Show.

NPS / Kilmannan Stud Mountain and Moorland In Hand Silver Medal Rosette for the best registered pony in the in-hand section. Winners are entitled to compete in The NPS Mountain and Moorland In-Hand Kilmannan Stud Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in Malvern in 2012, providing they send to the NPS Secretariat, the relevant entry fee and qualification card provided with the Silver Medal Rosette. **Judge – Mr P. Upton**

The Lady Willingdon Memorial Trophy to the breeder of the Supreme Champion of the Show. Presented at AGM.

The Hisley Challenge Cup presented by Mrs Jones and Miss Roberts for the Reserve Supreme Champion of the Show.

The Janus Challenge Cup presented by Miss S E Ferguson for the Champion stallion or colt. (Classes 3, 5 and 9).

The Carew Challenge Cup presented by Mrs Carew for the Champion mare or filly. (Classes 1,2,4,6,7, 10 and 12).

The National Pony Society Dartmoor Youngstock Challenge Cup presented by Mrs R M Taylor. (Classes 3 - 7).

The Shilstone Rocks Challenge Cup presented by Mr Reep and Mrs Newbolt-Young for the best pony owned by an exhibitor outside the counties of Devon, Cornwall and Somerset. (The 2 highest placed eligible ponies in classes 1 - 10, 12 and 14 to compete).

The Sweet Dreams Cup presented by Mrs E. Roe for the best pony in the youngstock classes 3 – 7 inclusive, owned by a member who does not possess more than 5 DARTMOOR PONIES. (EXCLUDING FOALS) ELIGIBILITY MUST BE SHOWN ON ENTRY FORM TO QUALIFY. (The 2 highest placed eligible ponies in classes 3 - 7 to compete)

The Oakdene Challenge Cup presented by Mr & Mrs de St.Croix for the best gelding in classes 3, 6, & 7. (The 2 highest placed eligible ponies in classes 3, 6 & 7 to compete)

The Lloyds Bank Challenge Trophy presented by Lloyds Bank for the best novice pony shown in hand. (Those eligible are ponies which have never won a First Prize in an in hand Dartmoor class at any show, except foal classes, prior to the closing date of entries, from classes 1 – 7, 9, 10, 12 and 14). ELIGIBILITY MUST BE SHOWN ON ENTRY FORM TO QUALIFY. (The 2 highest placed eligible ponies in the above listed classes to compete)

Class 22 The NPS/Picton M & M Novice Ridden National Championship. Open to pure bred registered M&M stallions, mares and geldings four years old and over. A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year it has done any of the following: [Entry £5.00]
Won an open NPS affiliated mixed M & M Ridden class
Won a class at an Olympia, HOYS or RIHS qualifying round
Qualified for HOYS or RIHS Ridden classes
Qualified for the M & M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.
Qualified for the M & M Ridden Championship final at Olympia in previous years.
Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit.
[Entry £5.00]

Class 23 Restricted Open Ridden Class. Open to mares and geldings only, 4 years old and over. [Entry £5.00]

Class 24 Open Ridden. This class is a qualifier for the **NPS/Baileys Horse Feeds Mountain and Moorland Ridden Pony of the Year at the Horse of the Year Show** (4th – 9th October 2011) to be held at the N.E.C. Birmingham. This competition is open to stallions, mares and geldings, four years old and over, to be registered in the main body of their respective stud books. Part-breds and mares with a living foal born during the current season are not eligible to compete.

Ponies must not exceed the height limits as stipulated by the Dartmoor Pony Society Stud Book. Ponies that qualify for the Championship at HOYS 2011 must hold a valid JMB Full Height or Annual Certificate, a copy of which must be sent at the time of entry to HOYS. JMB certificates are not required to enter this qualifier. Riders can be of any age with the exception of those riding stallions who must have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Correct riding attire must be worn, spurs are not allowed and whips must not exceed 30". Riders and/or Owners in cases of a junior member being the rider must be members of the Dartmoor Pony Society Stud Book, NPS, Ponies (UK) OR BSPS. Judges may only judge one qualifier during the current year and marks will be awarded as follows: Show, freedom of action - 50 maximum, Breed, type, conformation - 50 maximum. In the case of equality, the pony with the highest show, freedom of action mark will be deemed the winner.

Split Classes:

- (1) Where there are more than 20 entries forward in a class, the judges may split the class into sections according to the circumstances on the day.
- (2) Each section must be marked and the top five ponies with the highest marks should go forward to a final judging. The marks are not to be displayed at this point and no rosettes awarded.
- (3) For the final judging the top ponies should be invited back into the ring and lined up in any order. No further show will be given.
- (4) The judges should then refer to their original marks. In the case of equality the pony with the highest show, freedom and action mark will be deemed the winner. If there still be equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

The highest placed animal (not already qualified) from the first three in the final judging will qualify for the Horse of the Year Show 2011.

Entry Fee £20.00 (which includes £10.50 HOYS contribution)

Rosettes to 6th place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office

The 1st & 2nd placed ponies in classes 18-24 will be required for the Supreme Ridden Championship.

The 1st & 2nd placed ponies in Classes 19, 22 - 24 only can compete for the NPS Silver Medal Rosette.

- Class 25 Driving Class. Ponies 4 years and over. Show wagons and commercial vehicles barred.
- Sec. A Fully registered or Supplementary registered ponies, singles, driven to a suitable vehicle.
- Sec. B Part-bred ponies, singles, driven to a suitable vehicle.
- Sec. C Fully registered, Supplementary registered or Part-bred ponies, pairs, tandems, unicorns or teams driven to a suitable vehicle.
- To be judged as one class. Special Rosettes for the best in each section.
[Entry £5.00]
£20.00 attendance allowance will be paid for each turnout forward on the day.

- Class 26 Child Handler. Fully, supplementary registered and part bred ponies, to be led by child not having attained his/her 13th birthday before 1st January in the current year. This class may be divided if there are sufficient entries forward. NO COLTS OR STALLIONS. [Entry £3.00, also on the day]

Ring Three

Clear Round Jumping – Rosette for each clear round. See Rule 7. [Entry £3.00 per round]

- Class 27 Working Hunter Pony - Novice. Fully registered and Part-bred ponies, stallion, mare or gelding and supplementary registered mare or gelding 4 years and over. Jump height not more than 1' 9". Not to have won first place in any WHP competition by closing date of entries. To be ridden in any suitable bridle. (See Rule 10). [Entry £7.00, £8.00 on the day]

- Class 28 Working Hunter Pony - Open. Fully registered and Part-bred ponies, stallion, mare or gelding and supplementary registered mare or gelding 4 years and over. Jump height not more than 2'3" (See Rule 10). [Entry £7.00, £8.00 on the day]

Ring Four

- Class 29 Dressage. For fully registered, supplementary registered and part-bred ponies, 4 years and over, rider any age.
The test will be Preliminary 18, 2002 - Test sheets are available from British Dressage, Tel. 02476 698830.
Competitors are asked to book times to suit their other classes with the Dressage Steward on arrival at the showground. To be ridden in a snaffle bridle. [Entry £7.00, £8.00 on the day]
- Class 30 Handy Pony. (No jumps) Fully registered and part-bred stallion, mare or gelding and supplementary registered mare or gelding 4 years and over. No whips allowed. (See Rule 10). Rosettes for all competitors.
Sect. A – Leading Rein. Riders not to have attained their 9th birthday or 14th birthday if disabled.
Sect. B – Rider not to have attained their 17th birthday. Leading Rein not allowed. [Entry £3.00, also on the day]

Please note: Only ponies already entered in the show, prior to the closing date, are eligible for the classes that can be entered on show day.
