The Wilby New Breeders Youngstock Championship for ponies bred by exhibitors who have registered their **FIRST PUREBRED DARTMOOR FOAL WITHIN THE LAST TEN YEARS.** Ponies eligible must be produced and led by the owner/spouse or his/her children or grandchildren. Ponies must not have been produced professionally, nor should the owners have produced ponies for other people professionally. Qualifying rosettes will be awarded in classes 1 to 7 to all eligible exhibits, provided the handler is wearing a **white armband.** All rosette winners will go forward to the Championship.

Ponies shown in these classes must be produced and shown by the owner/spouse, or his/her immediate family, who does not derive income from working with ponies or horses. **Please enter this class in the spirit it is intended. Competitors who contravene the above will be disqualified.**

Male In Hand Championship from Male Youngstock Champion & Reserve & 1st & 2nd in classes 15.

Female In Hand Championship from Female Youngstock Champion & Reserve and 1st & 2nd in classes 10, 11 & 14.

Supreme In Hand Championship from Male & Female Champions & Reserves.

NPS / Kilmannan Stud M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship (SM-MMIH)

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS member in the M&M In Hand section. The Sponsor's Rosette is also awarded to the pony receiving the Qualification Card. (See NPS Silver Medal Championship Conditions in this schedule). Rule 12.

RIDDEN CLASSES Ring II

- Class 17 The NPS/Vale (UK) Ltd M&M Novice Leading Rein National Championship (MM-NLR)
Open to registered Dartmoor mares and geldings four years old or over not exceeding 122cm. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but must not have attained their 9th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.
Ponies never to have won a first prize of £10 or more in Leading Rein classes or qualified for the NPS/ Micor Demolition Mountain & Moorland Leading Rein Final before 1st January in current year. To be shown in a snaffle bridle.
- Class 18 The NPS/Simpson Refractories M&M Novice First Ridden National Championship (MM-NFR)
Open to registered Dartmoor mares and geldings four years old or over not exceeding 128cm. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but must not have reached their 12th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.
Ponies never to have won a first prize of £10 or more in First Ridden classes or qualified for the NPS/ Micor Demolition Mountain & Moorland First Ridden Final before 1st January in current year.

- Class 19 The NPS/Micor Demolition Ltd Mountain & Moorland Leading Rein National Championship (MM-LR)
Open to registered Dartmoor mares and geldings four years old or over not exceeding 122cm. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but must not have attained their 9th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. To be shown in a snaffle bridle.
- Class 20 The NPS/Micor Demolition Ltd Mountain & Moorland First Ridden National Championship (MM-FR)
Open to registered Dartmoor mares and geldings four years old or over not exceeding 128cm. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but must not have reached their 12th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.

Mini Championship

1st & 2nd Prize winners from Classes 17, 18, 19 & 20 to compete

Class 21 The NPS/Picton Mountain & Moorland Novice Ridden Championship (MM-NR)

Open to pure bred registered Dartmoor stallions, mares and geldings four years and over.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January of the current year it has done any of the following:

- i) won an open NPS affiliated M & M Ridden class
- ii) won a class in an Olympia/HOYS or RIHS Qualifying round,
- iii) qualified for HOYS or RIHS Ridden Classes
- iv) qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate Ridden Final at the NPS Summer Championship Show
- v) Qualified for the M&M Ridden Championship final at OLYMPIA in previous years.

Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit.

Class 22 The NPS/R H R Demolition Mountain & Moorland Junior Ridden National Championship (MM-JR)

Open to registered Dartmoor mares and geldings four years old or over. Riders must not have attained their 14th birthday before the 1st January in the current year

Class 23 The NPS/Dalgarvel Mountain & Moorland 4,5 & 6 year old Ridden National Championship (MM-4/5/6R)

Open to Dartmoor Stallions, Mares & Geldings 4yrs 5yrs & 6yrs old. Rider any age.

Class 24 The NPS RINGSIDE STUD Mountain & Moorland Open Ridden National Summer Championship (MM-OR)

Open to registered pure bred Dartmoor stallions, mares and geldings four years and over. Riders any age. See Rule 8.

Ridden Championship

1st & 2nd prize-winners from classes 21, 22, 23 & 24 to compete.

NPS/The Minns Mountain & Moorland Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship.

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by The National Pony Society for the best registered pony in the Mountain & Moorland Ridden Section. (see NPS Silver Medal Championship Conditions in this schedule *Rule 12*) (SM MMR)

Winners are entitled to compete in the NPS/The Minns Mountain and Moorland Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in Malvern, provided they send to the NPS Secretariat, the relevant entry fee and qualification card provided with the Silver Medal Rosette.

Young Rider Championship

Area 25 & the Underwood Family Young Rider Championship

In classes 20, 21, 22, 23 & 24

The Judge will award a qualification card to the rider most deserved under 26 years old.

Home Produced Ridden National Championship - Rosettes Direct

In classes 19, 20, 22, 23 & 24 the highest placed home produced pony will receive a qualifying rosette, provided the rider is wearing a white armband. Please see "home produced" classification in class 16

Unaffiliated Classes

- Class 25 Best Novice Rider. Mares and Geldings four years and over, Rider not to have won a 1st Prize in an affiliated class, may be led.
- Class 26 First, First Ridden, Riders over 5 years and under 11 years.
- Class 27 Pair Ponies. In Hand or Ridden. To be judged on similarity and how they go together. May be lead.
- Class 28 Young Handlers Aged 5 to 12 years Mares & Geldings only.
- Class 29 Best Rider, bareback. Mares & Geldings only. May be led.

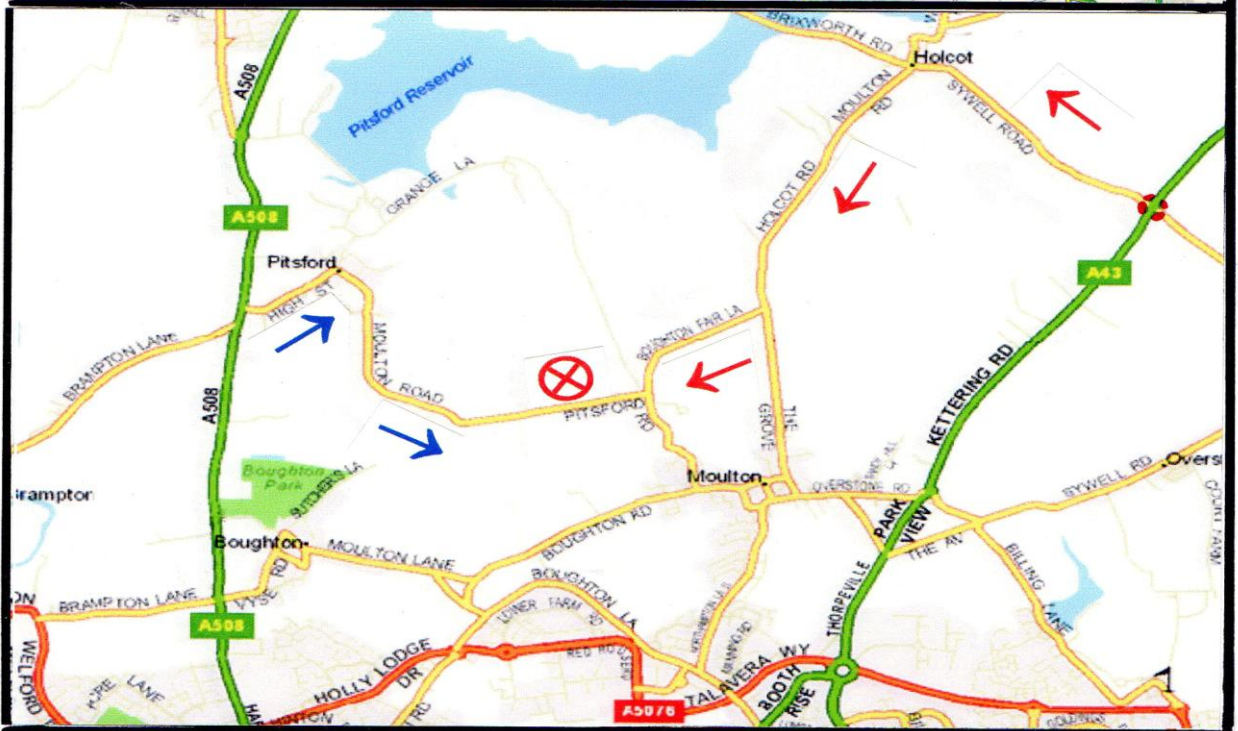
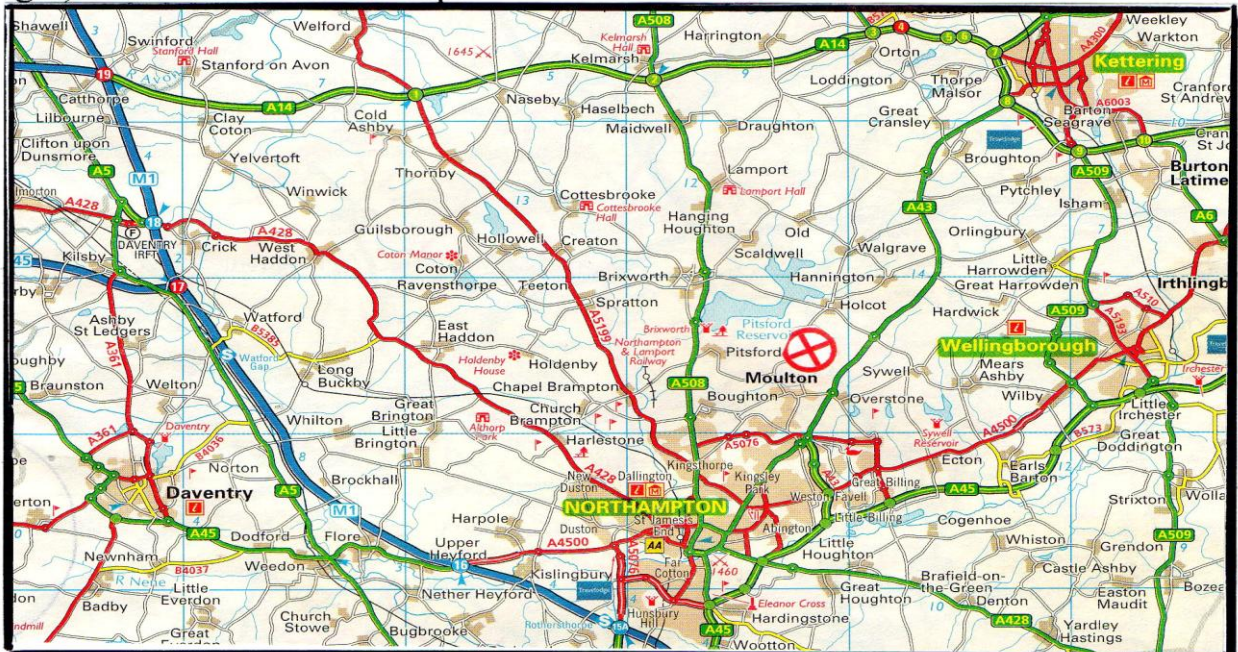

The Moulton College Equestrian Centre How to find us, recommended route avoiding Moulton Village

From the north (M1) leave at Junc.19 (A14 - Kettering,) Leave A14 at Junc 2 (A508 - Northampton) Leave A508 (turn left) through Pitsford Village and follow detailed map.

From the south (M1) leave at junc.15 follow A43 (Kettering) Leave A43 at Holcot roundabout (turn left) and follow detailed map.

From the east (A14) leave at Junc. 8 (A 43 - Northampton) Leave A43 at Holcot roundabout (turn right) and follow detailed map.



Special conditions for designated breed shows

a) NPS Membership Criteria

- Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members and at Breed Shows ponies can qualify for the final even if their owners are not NPS members.
- The owner of a pony qualifying at a Breed Show must become an NPS Full member for the pony to enter the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.
- At Breed Shows ponies can win Silver Medal Rosettes even if their owners are not members of the NPS but they must become NPS Full members to enter the final.

b) Judges

- At Breed Shows, M&M classes and M&M Silver Medal Rosette Championships can be judged by an NPS Panel Judge or by a judge from the Breed Panel concerned.

c) Classes

- At Breed Shows competitions that are normally split into five classes will only have classes appropriate to that Breed. i.e. Four classes at Welsh Breed Shows and one class at other Breed Shows.

Rules and Conditions

1. The Judges decision is final. The judges will be instructed to withhold any ordinary or special prize where there is evident lack of merit.
2. The Show reserves the right to take the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon on any pony exhibited.
3. The officials do not hold themselves responsible for any accident which may occur on the showground to spectators, competitors or animals. Dogs should be kept on a lead at all times.
4. Any person wishing to lodge an objection having reference to any persons or exhibit, shall do so in writing within thirty minutes of the completion of the class or championship, and at the same time shall deposit the sum of £20.00. If an investigation by the committee shows that the objection is not sustained, the said committee reserves the right that the deposit shall be forfeited and paid into the funds of the Show.
5. All foals must be at least 3 weeks old on the day of the Show.
6. The use of spurs in any class is forbidden. No whips or canes to exceed 30" or 76.2cm.
7. The committee reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate any class.
8. All stallions and colts 3 years and over must hold a current Ministry of Agriculture, National Pony Society or Dartmoor Pony Society Licence. All handlers of colts and stallions must have attained their 14th birthday, and riders of stallions must have attained their 11th birthday by 1st January in the current year.
9. THE MALE & FEMALE CHAMPIONS & RESERVES ARE REQUIRED FOR SUPREME IN-HAND CHAMPIONSHIP.
10. Correctly secured scull caps / riding hats must be worn at all times when mounted.
11. DPS Rosettes presented to members only.
12. NPS Rules for affiliated classes.

NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 3rd-5th August 2011.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified

receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. Judges and/or stewards will check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes and cards. NPS Standard members will be required to upgrade to Full membership to enter the final.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 3rd-5th August 2011.
