Directions: From M6 J 31 take the A59 towards Clitheroe/Skipton, turn left at the lights at the top of the hill, turn left at the first roundabout, take the left turn opposite the SAAB garage and take the next right and follow to the end of the lane.

Rules & Conditions

1. The show is run in accordance with the Bye-Laws of the Dartmoor Pony Society as amended/updated by Council.
2. No Member/Competitor/Exhibitor may knowingly show a pony in a class where the Judge has owned, bred, sold, leased, broken, trained or produced that pony or where the pony has been owned, bred, sold, leased, broken, trained or produced by the Judge's immediate family (husband, wife, parents, children, brother or sister) partner, employer or employee. An exhibitor may not show under a judge for whom he/she has produced, broken or trained an equine since 1st October in the previous year.
3. Please note that, with the exception of Classes 32,33 & 34, all ponies must be pure bred Dartmoor ponies registered in the main body of the Dartmoor Pony Society stud book or SR1 or SR2 registered ponies & registration number must be on entry form.
Entries close postmarked 21st May 2011, no advance entries after the closing date, however entries will be taken on the day for Progeny Pairs.
For all other classes catalogued ponies only may enter extra classes on the day at double fees.
- 4 Non-members to pay double entry fees. No substitution of exhibits to be permitted. Only ponies included in the catalogue may enter the ring on the day (unless a pony has been excluded in error by the secretary).
- 5 Owners must be members of the Dartmoor Pony Society to receive a DPS Rosette and must produce their current membership card at the time of the award. The Owner is the person in whose name the pony is registered in the DPS Stud Book.
- 6 All stallions & colts three years old & over must be in possession of either a Ministry of Agriculture Licence, a

Dartmoor Pony Society veterinary certificate or a Dartmoor Pony Society Veterinary Licence. All riders of stallions must have attained their 11th birthday by the 1st January in the current year in order to compete in all classes. All handlers of stallions & colts must have attained their 14th birthday by the 1st January in the current year.

7 Any person wishing to lodge a protest with reference to any person or exhibit shall do so in writing within 30 minutes of the termination of the class, & at the same time shall deposit a sum of £50.00. If on investigation by the committee the protest is not sustained the deposit shall be forfeited.

8 A correctly secured skull cap / riding hat no. BS 4472, PAS 015, EN 1384 or BS 6473 must be worn at all times when

mounted and also by competitors in the Young Handler classes.

9 No spurs to be worn in any ridden class.

10 Entry fees £9.00 per class. Progeny Pairs £9.00 per pair

Prizes 1st £10.00. 2nd £6.00. 3rd £4.00. 4th, 5th & 6th rosettes.

If there are 3 entries or fewer in the class only the first prize money will be awarded, if there are 4 to 6 entries, first and second prize money will be awarded, 7 entries or more, 1st 2nd and 3rd prize money will be awarded.

11 A Stamped Addressed Envelope is required with all entries, no numbers to be collected on the day except for Class 16

12 Stabling through Osbaldeston Riding Centre. Tel. 01254 813159. Ponies may not be coralled.

13 It is an offence to tie a pony to the outside of a trailer, wagon or any other structure unless attended by an adult at all times.

14 It is an offence to have ponies corralled anywhere on the show field.

15 The Northern Dartmoor Pony Show & its officials do not hold themselves responsible in any way for any loss, injury, or damage to any persons, animals or property in connection with the show. Each owner is asked to pay £3 to contribute towards the cost of the Paramedics on the field.

16 The committee reserves the right to amalgamate classes if insufficient entries are received.

17 The Owner/handler of any animal deemed to be out of control may be asked to remove the animal from the showground.

18 For both the Nappa Challenge Trophy and the Dykes Challenge Salver points to decide the winners will be awarded as

follows:- 1st - 3 points, 2nd - 2 points, 3rd - 1 point, Champion - 6 points, Reserve - 4 points.

19 TROPHIES. All trophies are the property of the NDPS. & are awarded annually. Trophies must be returned to Mrs S Weston: Guildford Clough Farm, Hollin Hall, Trawden, Colne, Lancs, BB8 8PT. Tel: 07843379801 by 15th May 2011 at the latest unless alternative arrangements have been agreed.

Before returning, trophies should be engraved and cleaned.

Anyone having a pre-arranged agreement to return trophies on Show day must have lodged them with the Show Secretary by 8.30 am.

NDPS Top of the North Championship: This Championship is open to Pure Bred ponies that have been bred in the North, are owned by a Northern member and exhibited by a Northern member. Exhibits eligible to compete for this

Championship will receive a marked Competitor Number indicating that the Exhibitor should wear a green armband in their In-Hand classes

and also for the Championship itself. The highest placed exhibit in each class whose handler is wearing a green armband

will be entitled to go forward to the Top of the North Championship.

For this Show the definition of 'North' is as follows:- Scotland, Northumberland, Durham, Cumbria, Yorkshire, Lancashire, Cheshire, Derbyshire, Cleveland, Nottinghamshire and Lincolnshire

NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS and are qualifiers for The National Pony Society Summer Championship Show to be held at Three Counties Showground 3rd - 5th August 2011. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members. As this Show is a Breed Show, the highest placed pony in each class will qualify for the

Final even if its owner is not an NPS member. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which has not already qualified will receive the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. The owner of a pony qualifying at a Breed show must become an NPS Full Member for the pony to enter the final at the NPS Summer Champ Show. NPS Adult/Standard members will be required to upgrade to Full Members to enter the final.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. An NPS Silver Medal Rosette will be awarded to the Supreme In-Hand Champion pony and to the Supreme Ridden Champion pony. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony. The Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than First Reserve. Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Rosette Championships.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the Final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 3rd - 5th August 2011

As this Show is a Breed Show the owner of the pony taking the Silver Medal Rosette and/or the Qualification Card need not be an NPS member. However, to compete in the Final at the Summer Championship Show the owner must become a Full member of the NPS

The NPS Home Produced Mountain & Moorland In Hand Championship

Please enter in the spirit it is intended. Competitors who contravene the following will be disqualified.

These classes are open to registered Mountain and Moorland ponies which are either stabled at home or in a DIY yard and which since 1st January in the current year have not been shown by a producer or stabled on a producer's yard other than on a DIY basis or at stud. Ponies shown in these classes must be produced and shown by the owner/spouse, or his/her immediate family who does not derive income from working with ponies or horses. At this Show the qualification will be competed for within the Supreme In-Hand Championship. It is requested that the handlers of all eligible exhibits forward in the Supreme In-Hand Championship should wear a Yellow armband.

The qualification will be awarded to the highest placed eligible exhibit in the Supreme In-Hand Championship DJP Northern Breeders In Hand Supreme Championship 2011. The Champion & Reserve Champion will qualify, the championship will be held at the NPS Area 4 North of England Show, held at Harrogate showground on Monday 29th August 2011.

"THE 1ST 2ND & 3RD IN EACH QUALIFYING CLASS WILL QUALIFY." for the 2011 P(UK) Summer National Championships To be held at the Newark & Notts Showground 10th - 13th August 2011. No qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, placings will be confirmed by results sent in by the show secretary.

Results must be submitted by the NDPS General Secretary to the Ponies(UK) offices within 14 days of the qualifying show. Qualification cards will not be presented in the ring.

Competitors in qualifying positions, who are not current members of P(UK) are allowed 14 days in which to become members and register their ponies in order for the qualification to remain valid.

2. Won a class at an Olympia, HOYS or RIHS qualifying round
3. Qualified for HOYS or RIHS ridden classes
4. Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show
5. Qualified for the M&M Ridden Championship final at Olympia in previous years.

Ponies must be ridden in a snaffle bridle.

Class 25 NDPS Open Ridden, to be judged as an open ridden for pure bred Dartmoor registered mares and geldings 4 years & over, rider any age.

To be judged under the rules of NPS & PUK, open to registered pure bred Dartmoor stallions mares or geldings four years old and over. Riders any age except those riding stallions who must have attained their 11th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. NPS/ Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship - wear white arm bands. The winner to receive the Wynhill Trophy kindly presented by Mrs Janty Barber.

Dartmoor Working Hunter Pony Classes - Judge: Ms G Wright

To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. Open to registered Dartmoor mares or geldings four years old or over not exceeding 128cms. Riders must have attained their 5th birthday but must not have attained their 12th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. Riders who have qualified for the HOYS/RIHS Mountain & Moorland WHP Championship before 1st January in the current year are not eligible.

Class 28 The NPS/Bowling Family / S13 P(UK) Northwest Supporters Confined M & M Novice WHP Championships.

To be judged under the rules of the National Pony Society. Open to registered pure bred Dartmoor stallions, mares or geldings, four years old or over not exceeding 128cms. Riders may only ride one pony in each class and can be any age except for those riding stallions who must have attained their 11th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. Ponies exceeding 122cms to jump first.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:-

- 1) Won an open NPS affiliated M & M WHP class,
- 2) Won a class at an M&M WHP HOYS or RIHS qualifying round
- 3) Qualified for the NPS M&M Novice or Intermediate WHP final at the NPS Summer Championship show
- 4) Qualified for an M & M WHP final at HOYS or RIHS in previous years or in the current year

Ponies must be ridden in a snaffle bit.
